This presentation aims to clarify Nishida Kitarō's conception of "pure experience" by staging an imaginary debate between the early Nishida and Kant. If we note that what Nishida refers to as "intellectual intuition" in An Inquiry into the Good is actually closer to what Kant called an "intuitive understanding" in the Critique of the Power of Judgment, then crucial distinctions between their two conceptions of "experience" come into view. Although an adjudicate between these two conceptions must be placed outside the purview of this presentation, by framing the debate in this way, we will be able to follow a thread that runs throughout Nishida's chapters on "Reality," "The Good," and "Religion."
